FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill would create a guide concession permit program managed by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) on state lands. The bill would essentially limit the number of guides that could operate in a designated area.

The bill establishes the initial area for the new guide concession program to be within Game Management Unit (GMU) 19 and requires DNR to consult with the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) and the Big Game Commercial Services Board (BGCSB) to implement and maintain the pilot program, including adopting regulations; issuing, renewing, transferring, suspending, or revoking a concession permit; and evaluating the program after two years to determine if it has furthered land use and management objectives and if the program should be established statewide. The ADF&G Commissioner is specifically tasked with determining the number and type of concession permits that may be provided in each GMU with a minimum of two.

Additional Division of Wildlife Conservation (DWC) staff time would be required to prepare and provide wildlife information as well as resident, non-resident, guided, and unguided hunt information. The department anticipates personal services costs to DWC for an additional Wildlife Biologist III (permanent full-time) position at \$112.3 to assist with standing up and managing the program if it is established on a statewide basis.

If the guide concession program is not established statewide, the Wildlife Biologist III would be eliminated after termination of the pilot program.
