

National Statistics


- 4 million women & 2.5 million men live with Alzheimer's disease
- The number of individuals experiencing Alzheimer's disease is projected to increase to 13.8 million by 2060
- In 2022 the cost of Alzheimer's disease in the US was \$321 billion






Elder Statistics in Alaska

Alaska has the fastest growing elder population per capita in the nation. Increased 68% between 2010 and 2022.

Dementia in Alaska

- A 2016 study in Alzheimer's & Dementia found the incidence of dementia was highest among American Indians/Alaska Natives and African Americans compared to non-Hispanic whites.
- In 2021, **25 thousand** caregivers of people living with ADRD provided over **39 million** hours of care, valued at **\$795 million**.
- In 2023, the average cost of nursing home care in Alaska was over \$400 thousand per year, while the U.S. average was just under \$109 thousand per year.
- By 2030, Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias (ADRD) is projected to affected an estimated
 23,900 Alaskan elders.
