## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA  
2018 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 129

### Analysis

This legislation would allow most fish and game offenses to be charged as violations rather than criminal offenses; allow the state to collect restitution from resource users who fail to obtain a hunting or fishing license; and increase the strict liability fine amounts on commercial fishing violations.

This legislation also allows a person to correct a citation for not having a sport fishing, hunting, or trapping license, permit, or tag on their person while exercising their hunting, fishing, or trapping rights in the field. It also prohibits a person from obtaining a sport fishing, hunting, or trapping license, permit, or tag in Alaska if they have had these same rights previously suspended or revoked in Alaska or any other state.

Passage of this bill would have no fiscal impact to the Department of Public Safety's Division of Alaska Wildlife Troopers.
