## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA

BILL NO. HB 129

### Analysis

This bill creates violations for certain fish and game offenses; amends fines relating to hunting and commercial fishing violations; and allows lost federal matching funds from Pittman-Robertson and Dingell-Johnson/Wallop-Breaux programs to be included in an order of restitution. The bill would allow the court or municipality to dismiss a citation for a person sport fishing, hunting, or trapping without a licenses in their physical possession upon proof of compliance.

These violations, amendments to fines, change in order of restitution, and allowing for citation dismissal have the potential to impact criminal fines and penalties revenue that flows into the general fund, but would not impact civil fines and penalties that are directed to the Fish and Game fund, which is a dedicated fund. Furthermore, this does not change the department's expenditure authorization. Therefore, while this bill may impact general fund receipts to the state, it does not impact the department's budget.
