Analysis

HB 52 requires the Department of Health to prepare, publish online, and provide to the legislature, an annual report regarding minors placed in psychiatric hospitals. The report includes data provided by the Department of Family and Community Services concerning minors in state custody receiving treatment at in-state and out-of-state psychiatric hospitals.
Department of Family and Community Service- Division of Juvenile Justice and Office of Children's Services can provide the necessary data with no fiscal impact.

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
