Analysis

House Bill 126 would extend workers' compensation protection to Alaska State Defense Force Soldiers during and traveling to and from training exercises. Passage of HB126 would neither increase required administrative actions and documentation following an injury to a member of Alaska's organized militia, nor would it have material effect on the Alaska Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs or the products and services we deliver; therefore, we are submitting a zero fiscal note.
