

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
Since FY2015 we have eliminated programs not directly related to our mission and core services, and trimmed each remaining program.


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- GF includes Unrestricted General Funds (UGF) and Designated General Funds (DGF)
- The FY19 Gov Adjusted included two items that are not included in the Governor's budget
  - \$300.0 Boating Receipts reclassified from Other to DGF
  - \$1,125.0 Fire Crew Contingency Language in Fire Suppression Activity
- GF overall has decreased by \$6.8 M since FY2009
  - UGF (21%), 49% of budget in FY2015, 39% in FY2019
  - DGF +33%, 15% of budget in FY2015, 22% in FY2019
- Increased reliance on DGF, revenue DNR generates from fees
  - Parks passes, campground fees, PUCs, Material sales, mining leases, etc.
  - New fee regulations in place for DGGS to sell seismic data
  - New fee regulations for DMLW & Parks should be in place in the next month or so
  - \$7.7 M in fund source changes since FY2016 (DMLW, DGGS, FOR, Parks), \$5M from existing fees, \$2.7 M from new revenue
- FY2015 included AKLNG UGF \$10M, in FY2016 it was categorized as Other (ISPF)
- Bump in FY2018 is ASTAR multi-year operating of \$7.3M




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- Personal services continue to make up the majority of our costs
  - FY2009 PCNs - 1,095 (avg cost 75.0)
  - FY2019 PCNs – 900 (avg cost 98.0) – 24% increase
  - Since FY2015 (207), -19%
- Contractual costs include air tanker and helicopter contracts for wildland firefighting, flying field surveys for data collection, core services (HR, IT, Leases, Risk Mgmt, etc.)
- Actual Travel expenditures are down 40% between FY2015 and FY2017 (excluding fire activity), and a significant portion of fire-related travel is federally reimbursed



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- Steady decline in all RDUs since our high in FY2015 except for
  - \$1,125.0 Fire Crew Contingency Language
  - \$300.0 Boating Receipts reclassification to DGF
- RDU Fire Suppression, Land & Water Resources (FOR, DMLW, DGGS)
- RDU Administration & Support (CO, SSD, OPMP, EVOS, PIC, TLO, AKLNG, Chargeback & Facilities)
  - AKLNG \$10M in FY2015, \$9M in FY2016
  - ASTAR in FY2018
- RDU Oil & Gas = DOG
- RDU Parks & Outdoor Recreation (PKS, OHA)
- RDU Agriculture (Agr Dev, PMC, ARLF)
  - MMMS was eliminated in FY2018, hence the large drop in Division of Agriculture.
- Backlogged Applications in DMLW
  - FY2011 2600
  - FY2017 940



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- \$2.4 M overall decrease in empty authority across the department in FY2019 (IA, CIP, Fed, SDPR)
- FED increases in FY2017 & FY2018 mainly from *Tongass Young Growth Cost Share Agreement* and *Forest Inventory & Analysis* funding.
- SPCO transferred from Admin & Support RDU in FY2015
- SPCS collapsed into DOG in FY2017

The division regularly uses reservoir models on the North Slope and Cook Inlet for the purpose of determining that royalty interest is correctly divided among the state and other royalty owners as field developments expand over time. In some cases, these royalty redeterminations are stipulated in unit agreements; in other instances they may be initiated either by the state, the other royalty owner(s), or the operating company.

A 2009 CIP was appropriated for this purpose and has been used to hire consultants and pay licensing costs for sophisticated software.

In FY2018 the majority of the capital project was reappropriated. \$500.0 remained in the project to fund FY2018 efforts with the understanding that operating increments would be requested in FY2019.

- 250.0 OTI to hire outside contractors for imminent redeterminations (6 scheduled in FY2018 & FY2019)
- 250.0 INC for reservoir modeling software licensing

Without these increments the division will not be able to perform this critical work and the state may forego significant revenue.
