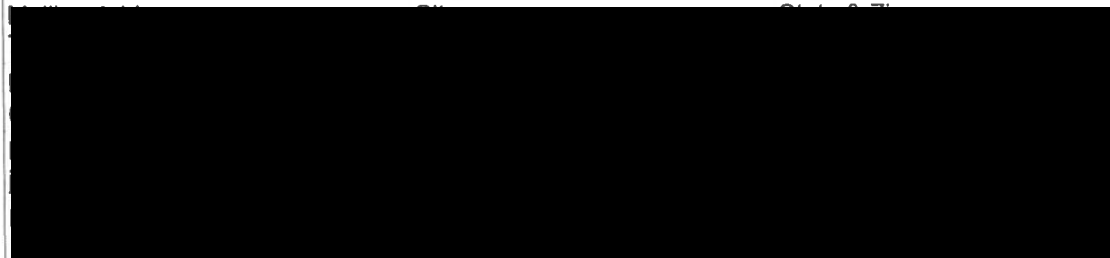

Pipeline Regulation: Janis Wilson has regulated pipelines in Alaska for 37 years. Governor Hammond appointed her to serve on the Alaska Pipeline Commission. When the Legislature authorized merger of the Pipeline Commission into the Alaska Public Utilities Commission (APUC), she oversaw the merger as the last chairman of the Pipeline Commission. Legislation authorizing the merger created the position of pipeline administrative law judge to ensure adequate coverage of lengthy and complex Trans Alaska Pipeline System and other North Slope pipeline cases, many of which were held concurrently with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) in Washington, D.C. Janis Wilson was the pipeline administrative law judge for 25 years, presiding over all hearings the APUC and RCA held concurrently with the FERC. She also handled electric, gas, and water and sewer utility cases for the commission.

At a time when North Slope gas pipeline issues were becoming increasingly important to the state, Governor Murkowski appointed her as a Commissioner of the RCA, ensuring that pipeline expertise was represented on the Commission. Governor Parnell reappointed her in 2012. As an RCA Commissioner, Janis Wilson worked to assure appropriate due process and record-driven decisions for litigants, served as docket manager of pipeline cases, and helped institute net metering for Alaska electric utilities—an incentive for customer-owned renewable generation.

Early Career: As Kenai City Attorney, Janis Wilson prosecuted misdemeanors and advised the city council and all city departments, including the city's utilities. In that capacity she became familiar with Kenai Peninsula issues and Cook Inlet oil and gas issues. In the Oil and Gas Special Litigation Section of the Juneau AG's office she worked on Cook Inlet and North Slope oil and gas issues. Living in Juneau she became familiar with Southeast issues.
