Analysis

This bill would change the method by which Board of Game and Board of Fisheries members ethics determinations are made. While it may change how much time a board will spend on the "ethics disclosure" portion of a board meeting, it is interdeterminable whether that time will increase or decrease. Much will depend on the meeting, the member's background, and subjects before the board. In either case, it is not expected to require more board meeting days to accomodate this change.
