Analysis

Analysis/Assumptions:

This bill maintains the Department of Environmental Conservation's statutory authority over barbers, hairdressers, manicurists, and estheticians, and adds authority over hair braiding in AS 44.46.020. This bill also introduces a new limited license for non-chemical barbering, which would be regulated by the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers in the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development (DCCED), designates a license type for hair braiding, and imposes requirements on shop owners to display shop and employee licenses conspicuously.

The current version of the bill allows the Department's existing regulations to be enforced by the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers, and maintains the Department's ability to regulate and enforce regulations pertaining to body piercing, tattooing, and permanent cosmetic coloring.

The Department discontinued oversight of barbers, hairdressers, manicurist, and esthetician facilities in FY2016. Currently the Department's work is limited to inspection of high-risk body art facilities which is funded by a reimbursable services agreement with DCCED. The duties and authorities are unchanged in the proposed bill, and the result would have no fiscal impact to the Department.
