



HB 202: Opioid Overdose Drugs in Schools

Explanation of Changes from Version S to U

Changed the term “Naloxone Nasal Spray” to “An Opioid Overdose Drug” throughout the bill.

Section 1 AS 14.30.145

Removed language stating an opioid overdose drug must be at school sponsored events off school grounds, it would now only be required at school sponsored events conducted on school grounds.

Removed language requiring school bus drivers to be trained to administer an opioid overdose drug and language requiring at least one dose at a school sponsored events off school grounds and on a school bus while students are being transported.

Added language requiring the Department of Health to provide each school district with the opioid overdose drug.

Added language protecting school districts and schools from liability for civil damages if an individual is injured resulting from a failure to possess or maintain an opioid overdose drug.

Renumbered all sections accordingly.

Section 2 AS 17.20.085

Removed definition for Naloxone Nasal Spray.

Renumbered all sections accordingly.
