FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. SB 171

Analysis

This bill amends Alaska Statute (AS) 16.05.415(a) to require a person to be physically present in the state at all times as outlined in AS 16.05.415(a)(2) to maintain a domicile in the state for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the application of a license for a resident sport fishing, hunting, or trapping license. It provides for an allowable absence to this requirement as outlined under AS 43.23.008, which is the Permanent Fund Dividend allowable absence statute. The Department of Public Safety does not anticipate a significant fiscal impact and is submitting a zero fiscal note.
