BILL NO. HB 400

Analysis

This bill amends statute regarding Correspondence Study Programs by adding language clarifying what are allowable and disallowable expenditures for the student allotments. It also requires the State Board of Education to include additional data elements regarding correspondence study programs in their annual report to the legislature.

Additionally, this bill repeals AS 14.03.300(b), *Correspondence study programs; individual learning plans*, and AS 14.03.310(b), *Student allotments*.

Section 6 of this bill, *Report to the legislature*, takes effect on the effective date of sec. 23, ch. 40, SLA 2022.

The one-time cost of \$6.0 is needed for regulation development with the Department of Law.
