FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 360

Analysis

House Bill 360 amends Alaska Statute 44.29 to include a new section to establish a Home Care Employment Standards Advisory Board. This board will consist of ten voting members including the Commissioner of the Department of Labor and Workforce Development or the commissioner's designee and nine members appointed by the Commissioner of the Department of Health. The board will advise and consult with the department on medical assistance program payment rates for personal care services, hourly respite services, and chore services; investigate matters related to wages, working conditions, and workforce adequacy of workers providing these services.

House Bill 360, the establishment of the advisory board, has no fiscal impact on the Department of Health, Office of Rate Review since work related to medical assistance program payment rates is already being done. Actions and determinations of the commissioner once the board is established to accept recommendations that result in increases to provider rates will impact the Medicaid Services budget.
