



## Senate Bill 95, version S Sectional Analysis

*“An Act relating to special request specialty organization registration plates; relating to special registration plates commemorating peace officers killed in the line of duty; and providing for an effective date.”*

**Section 1:** Creates a new subsection in the Motor Vehicle statutes, AS 28.10.181, to require the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to adopt regulations allowing for the issuance of specialty organization license plates sponsored by certain charitable and government organizations within Alaska.

Section 1 also incorporates the creation of special request plates commemorating peace officers killed in the line of duty, the guidelines for the plates, as well as the definition of “peace officer” to include:

- State Troopers
- Municipal police forces
- Village Public Safety Officers
- Corrections officers
- Court officers
- Any other public servants vested with a duty to maintain public order and make arrests

**Section 2:** Adds special request plates for the United States Space Force, women veterans, and retired women veterans.

**Section 3:** Adds a new paragraph to the motor vehicle registration fee rate statutes (AS 28.10.421) setting fees for specialty request plates under the future DMV regulatory process at a one-time \$100, though requesting entities may increase the amount. This section also includes the specific peace officer commemorative plate fee at \$30 biennially.

**Section 4:** Adds a new section of uncodified law to create a design committee for women veteran specialty license plates.

**Section 5:** Provides an immediate effective date.
