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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. CSHB 148

Analysis

This bill amends the qualification criteria for an Alaska Performance Scholarship (APS) applicant by adding an option for career and technical education (CTE) to the academic curriculum; and inserts a definition for career cluster.

The CTE academic curriculum options include:

(Option 1) substituting one CTE course credit for one standard course credit of social studies in the Math and Science Curriculum track;

(Option 2) substituting two CTE course credits, one year of which includes two semesters of sequentially more rigorous content within a career cluster, for two course credits of a world language in the Social Studies and Language Curriculum track; and

(Option 3) creates an additional Social Studies and Language Curriculum track that includes substituting one CTE course credit for one standard course credit of social studies, in addition to two years of a world language.

For the postsecondary level, this bill raises the award amounts for all three levels and removes the requirement for a college entrance exam. Additionally, the eligibility period for receiving the scholarship is extended from six to eight years.

The bill also directs the Alaska Commission of Postsecondary Education (ACPE) to evaluate awardees' grade-point averages after two semesters providing the opportunity for the award to increase based on postsecondary performance.

The department would need to make the necessary regulation changes to bring APS regulations into conformity with the addition of CTE to the academic curriculum, award dates, and deadlines. There is a one-time increment of \$6.0 to implement the necessary regulation changes.

The bill provides the continuation of a grant allocated to the Galena City School District for the Galena Interior Learning Academy (GILA) by DEED from the Alaska Workforce Investment Board (AWIB) as part of the Technical Vocational Education Program (TVEP) grant in the amount of \$599.7 annually.

Section 14 of this Act, TVEP funding, takes effect immediately. This bill also contains a retroactive clause if the Act takes effect after June 30, 2024.

This bill directs the department to provide the grant allocations to Head Start Programs by the department to meet the full non-federal match of 20% totaling \$5,375.8 to supplement the Governor's FY25 budgeted amount of \$7,135.0. This section of the bill takes effect July 1, 2024.
