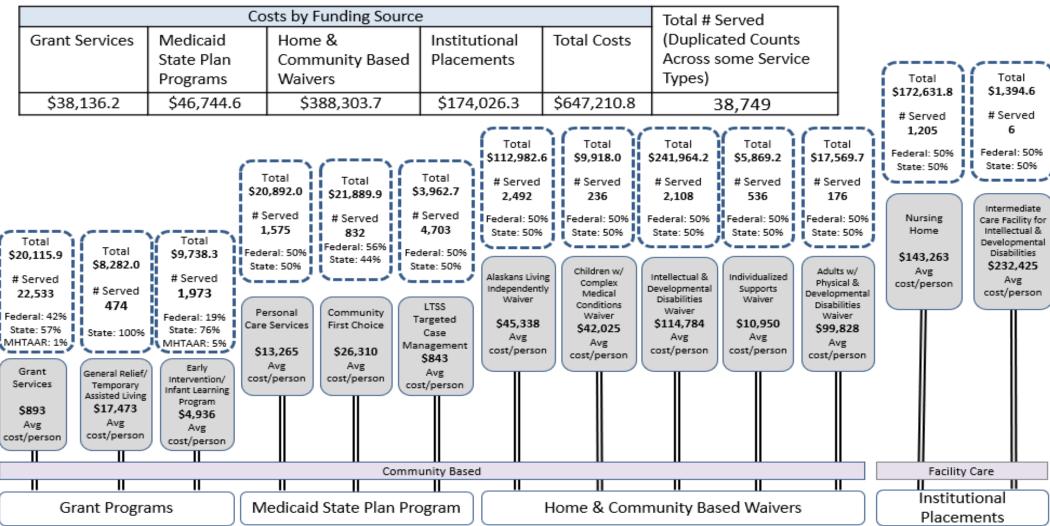

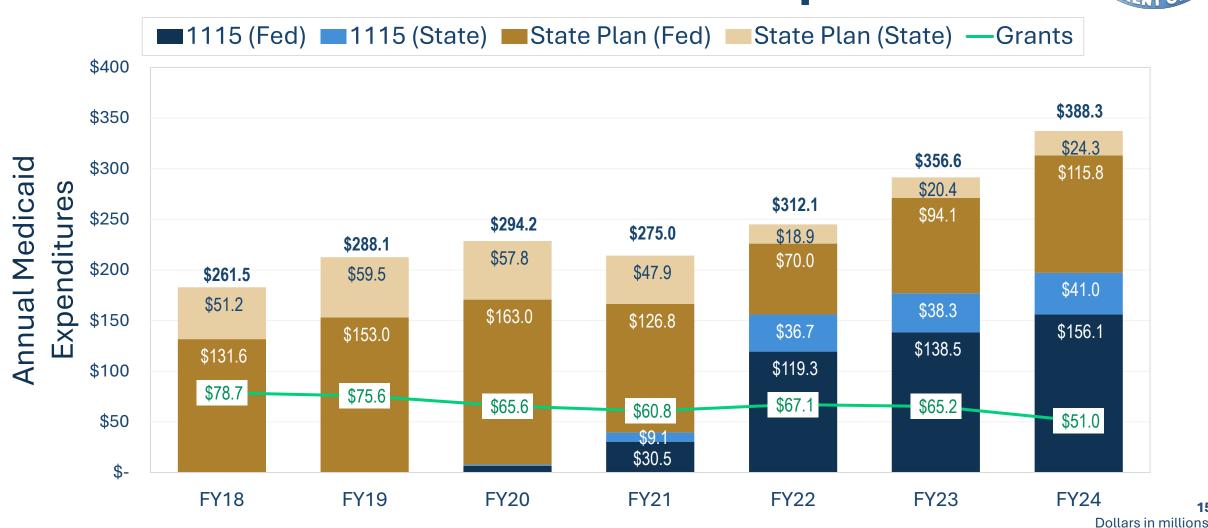

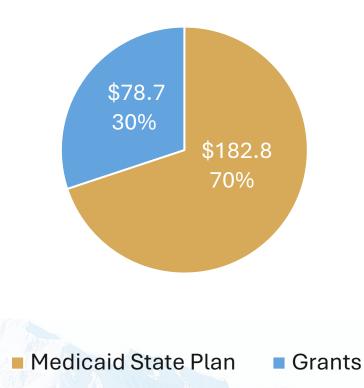


#### FY2018 – FY2024 Service Expenditures

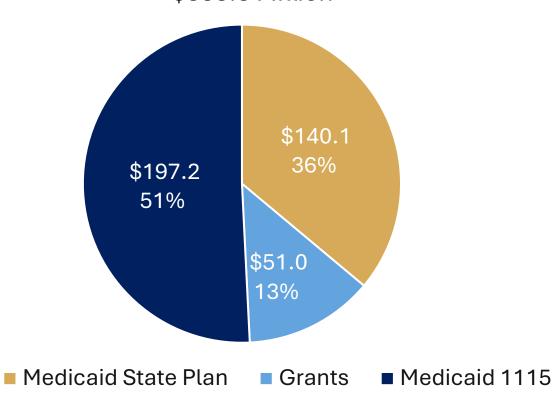


#### **Fiscal Year Spending Source Comparison**
