Analysis

This bill amends AS 14.03 by adding the requirement for all students in grade nine through 12 to complete the equivalent of a one-half credit hour financial literacy course. This course would be added to the list of graduation requirements for all students, with the exception of students who haven't completed an equivalent course and have transferred to an Alaska school after 10th grade. The Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) would be required to maintain a list of approved, open educational resources available to meet this requirement.

This fiscal note contains three one-time expenses: 1) \$30.0 for stipends (\$1.5 each) for 20 educators and community stakeholders for participation in the development of a rubric to evaluate courses, and to complete a review of existing open educational resources based on the developed rubric; 2) \$40.0 to contract an education expert to facilitate the development of a rubric and evaluation of courses; and, 3) \$6.0 for legal fees to implement the necessary regulation changes.

DEED plans to hold the necessary stakeholder engagement meetings with participating educators and community stakeholders virtually and to publish the approved course list electronically on the DEED website.

This bill would take effect July 1, 2026.
