FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

**STATE OF ALASKA
2018 LEGISLATIVE SESSION****Analysis**

This legislation increases the maximum unemployment compensation weekly benefit amount from \$370 to \$510 effective January 1, 2018; and sets forth criteria to follow for increases in future years. As benefits are paid directly from Alaska's Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund account in the United States Treasury, this increase in the benefit amount will not impact the State budget.

Costs associated with implementing this legislation will be covered within the current budget by the federal Unemployment Insurance administrative grant.
