"An Act establishing the crime of airbag fraud."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

3	* Section 1. AS 28.35 is amended by adding a new section to read:		
4	Sec. 28.35.248. Airbag fraud. (a) A person commits the crime of airbag fraud		
5	if the person		
6	(1) knowingly sells, offers for sale, imports, installs, or reinstalls		
7	(A) a replacement airbag that does not comply with federal		
8	safety regulations specific to the vehicle's make, model, and year;		
9	(B) an airbag that is counterfeit or nonfunctioning; or		
10	(C) a part or device that is intended to conceal a counterfeit or		
11	nonfunctioning airbag;		
12	(2) knowingly manufactures		
13	(A) a counterfeit or nonfunctioning airbag; or		
14	(B) a part or device that is intended to conceal a counterfeit or		
15	nonfunctioning airbag; or

(3) intentionally sells, leases, or trades or offers for sale, lease, or trade 1 2 a vehicle that the person knows has 3 (A) a replacement airbag that does not comply with federal safety regulations specific to the vehicle's make, model, and year; or 4 (B) a counterfeit or nonfunctioning airbag. 5 (b) This section does not apply to 6 (1) a person installing, reinstalling, or replacing an airbag on a vehicle 7 8 used solely for police work; 9 (2) an owner or employee of a motor vehicle dealership or the owner 10 of a vehicle who, before the sale of the vehicle, does not have knowledge that the 11 vehicle's airbag is counterfeit or nonfunctioning; 12 (3) a person who transfers a vehicle title to an insurance company to satisfy an insurance claim when the insurance company declares the vehicle to be an 13 14 actual total loss or constructive total loss: 15 (4) an insurance company that sells or otherwise disposes of a vehicle 16 as authorized by law or regulation; or 17 (5) a person who, before the sale, lease, or trade of a vehicle, discloses 18 to the buyer or lessee that the vehicle contains an airbag that is inoperable, damaged, 19 recalled, has previously been deployed, causes a vehicle's diagnostic system to 20 inaccurately indicate that the vehicle is equipped with a properly functioning airbag, or results in an electric fault detected by a vehicle's diagnostic system after the 21 22 installation procedure was completed. 23 (c) This section does not 24 (1) preclude liability of any party in a civil action; or 25 (2) create a duty that, before the sale of a vehicle, an owner or 26 employee of a motor vehicle dealership or the owner of the vehicle inspect a vehicle in 27 the possession of the dealership or owner to determine whether the airbag is counterfeit or nonfunctioning. 28 29 (d) In this section, 30 (1) "airbag" includes an airbag component; 31 "counterfeit" means a replacement airbag displaying an (2)

3	(3) "nonfunctioning" means a replacement airbag that		
4	(A) is inoperable;		
5	(B) is damaged;		
6	(C) is recalled;		
7	(D) has previously been deployed;		
8	(E) will cause a vehicle's diagnostic system to inaccurately		
9	indicate that the vehicle is equipped with a properly functioning airbag; or		
10	(F) results in an electric fault detected by a vehicle's diagnostic		
11	system after the installation procedure is complete;		
12	(4) "recalled" means an airbag that was removed from a vehicle		
13	because a manufacturer or federal agency determined the airbag created an		
14	unreasonable safety risk or did not meet minimum safety standards and that federal		
15	law has not exempted from reinstallation.		
16	(e) Airbag fraud is		
17	(1) a class A misdemeanor; or		
18	(2) a class C felony if death or serious physical injury to another		
19	person results from		
20	(A) the manufacture, sale, importation, installation, or		
21	reinstallation of a replacement airbag that does not comply with federal safety		
22	regulations specific to the vehicle's make, model, and year or a counterfeit or		
23	nonfunctioning airbag; or		
24	(B) the sale, lease, or trade of a vehicle that has a replacement		
25	airbag that does not comply with federal safety regulations specific to the		
26	vehicle's make, model, and year or a counterfeit or nonfunctioning airbag.
