Sectional Analysis

"An Act relating to the disclosure of the ingredients in cosmetics; and providing for an effective date."

Section 1:

Section 1 of House Bill 28 adds a new section to the Alaska Food, Drug, and Cosmetics Act, section 17.20.153, the cosmetic ingredients disclosure, which makes it so that a manufacturer of cosmetics or personal care items sold or distributed within the State of Alaska must disclose a full list of ingredients in the cosmetic or personal care item on their website, including fragrances, flavors, and color additives. The ingredients must also be listed in descending order of predominance for each ingredient in the cosmetic, with an exception of ingredients found to be at a concentration of 1% or less of the product. The manufacturer shall also include Chemical Abstracts Service number of each ingredient.

Section 2:

Section 2 of House Bill 28 amends AS 17.20.290 (a), which establishes prohibited acts within the Alaska Food, Drug and Cosmetics Act by adding section (14): to prohibit failure to comply with section 17.20.153, which section 1 of House Bill 28 added to the Alaska Food, Drug and Cosmetics Act.

Section 3:

Section 3 of House Bill 28 amends AS 17.20.290 (b) to include (14), added in section 2, to ensure that the commissioner of environmental conservation or a designee of the commissioner is responsible for enforcing the provisions that section 2 added.

Section 4:

Provides an effective date of July 17, 2017.
