


NPR-A Background



The NPR-A covers 22.5 million federal acres of public land on Alaska's North Slope.



NPR-A Lease Sales



2018 tracts available for leasing (white)



NPR-A Funds

- The NPR-A is managed by the federal government
- 50% of funds received from the “sales, rentals, bonuses, and royalties on leases issued...” go to the State of Alaska
- The monies are to be used for:
 - (a) planning,
 - (b) construction, maintenance, and operation of essential public facilities, and
 - (c) other necessary provisions of public service: Provided further, that in the allocation of such funds, the State shall give priority to use by subdivisions of the State most directly or severely impacted by development of oil and gas leased under this section.

Impact Grant Program Objective

The primary objective of the NPR-A Impact Mitigation Program is to provide eligible municipalities with grants to help mitigate significantly adverse impacts related to oil and gas development within the NPR-A.

FY19 Projects

\$11,611,722 awarded

16 projects across five communities, plus North Slope Borough

- Monitoring Waterfowl in NPR-A
- Monitoring Nearshore Fish and their Habitats in NPR-A
- Area- Wide Air Quality Studies
- Support Local Government Operations and Youth Programs for all five communities

Six communities were eligible this year, all received funding:

North Slope Borough, Nuiqsut, Wainwright, Atqasuk, Anaktuvuk Pass, Utqiagvik



FY20 Impact Mitigation Grant Timeline

August 15, 2018

Grant application letter distributed to eligible applicants

November 15, 2018

Postmark due date for completed applications

January 2019

Projects lists (committee selections) become publicly available

Late April 2019

Legislature appropriates funding, grant awards made
