Mission Statement:

The mission of the therapeutic courts is to divert people with substance abuse and/or mental health diagnoses with open court cases (both criminal and civil) into community treatment and services to prevent further contact with the legal system.



Therapeutic Courts



- Are NOT an easy way out...
- They are an alternative for those who want to stop the downward spiral of a life of substance abuse or mental health issues and legal involvement.



Therapeutic Courts



A non-adversarial approach in which together, the Therapeutic Court Team:

- Ensures public safety
- Protects due process rights
- Systematically addresses defendant's substance abuse, mental health, family, and criminality issues



Therapeutic Courts Program Requirements



- Compliance with Rule 11 (plea) agreement
- Compliance with case and treatment plans
- Frequent, random and fully observed drug testing
- If indicated, use of an adjunctive medication to stop cravings
- Attendance at recovery meetings and alumnifacilitated process groups
- Maintain employment or benefits, and safe, sober housing



Therapeutic Courts – Addiction Courts






- By statute, DUI offenders must complete an 18month program
- Treatment, community supervision, and drug/alcohol testing
- Depending on offense, possibility of sentence reduction or charge dismissal

Miscellaneous offense types include: criminal mischief, escape




Coordinated Resources Projects – Mental Health Courts




- Beneficiary of the Alaska Mental Health Trust:
 - Mental Illness
 - Chronic Alcohol or Drug Addiction
 - Traumatic Brain Injury
 - Developmental Disability, Including FASD
 - Alzheimer's & Dementia
- Individualized case plan that addresses treatment and public safety
- Depending on offense, possibility of sentence reduction or charge dismissal

Therapeutic Courts – Veterans Court




- Anchorage court established in 2004; Fairbanks court established in 2022
- These courts honor Veterans and their service to the country
- Connects Veteran offenders to services provided by the Veterans Administration for mental health and substance abuse issues, housing, and employment

Miscellaneous offense types include: robbery, weapons, criminal mischief



Anchorage Child-In-Need-of Aid (CINA) Court



- Accelerate permanency in child welfare cases by providing enhanced court oversight for parents or custodians in need of recovery services.
- The CINA Therapeutic Court operates as a parallel court for participants with on ongoing CINA case.





Palmer Families with Infants and Toddlers Court (PFIT)




- A community engagement and systems-change approach
- The primary goals are to achieve permanency within twelve months and to reunify young children with their families of origin
- Involvement in the therapeutic court promotes child safety by encouraging wrap-around recovery services for parents and custodians






All Therapeutic Courts Participant Outcomes - 2024



Estimated Jail Time Saved by FY24 Graduates



- ➤ Anchorage Felony DUI/Drug Court 54 Years
- ➤ Fairbanks Wellness Court 22 Years
- ➤ Palmer Wellness Court 36 Years
- ➤ Juneau Therapeutic Court 6 Years

Estimated total saved = 118 Years @ \$202 Cost/day
