Analysis

This bill would allow for broader use of computer like technology (e.g. tablets) within Department of Corrections (DOC) facilities.

This bill amends AS 33.30.015 granting the authority to establish a dedicated corrections inmate tablet program to allow the use of inmate tablets. This change would allow inmates access to electronic tablets and expands the use to include prisoner rehabilitation, compliance with a reentry or case plan, access for legal materials, visitation, health care or other purposes identified through regulation. This would allow DOC to have the authority to establish a dedicated corrections inmate tablet program to allow the use of inmate tablets.

This bill also adds AS 33.30.015(f) by stating that virtual visitation may not replace in person visitation when available, virtual rehabilitation may not replace in person rehabilitation when available. The use of electronic devices may only supplement the items listed above, not replace them.

As this bill is only granting the authority to establish an inmate tablet program, there is no immediate financial impact.
