Analysis

This bill extends the sunset of the Alaska Regional Development Organization (ARDOR) program to July 1, 2021 and lessens the reporting requirements in the absence of a state appropriation for grants to ARDORs.

Grant funding was included in the Governor's request but was removed in both the House and the Senate subcommittee budgets.
