Analysis

This bill amends AS 11.56.767(d) by changing the failure to report a violent crime committed against an adult from a violation to a class B misdemeanor.

The impact of this change is anticipated to increase the daily inmate population; however, based on current offender population counts, this increase will not exceed the current available bed capacity within the prison system. Therefore, there is no immediate financial impact associated with these changes and a zero fiscal note is submitted.
