STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 170

Analysis

HB 170 elevates the offense of failing to report a violent crime against an adult from a violation to a class B misdemeanor. This change allows for arrest and prosecution but does not create new duties for the Department of Public Safety. Troopers will enforce the offense as part of routine investigative work. There is no fiscal impact; costs will be absorbed within existing operations.
