FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS**STATE OF ALASKA
2015 LEGISLATIVE SESSION****Analysis**

This bill outlines a Military Code of Justice for Alaska.

Relevant to the Department of Health and Social Services, this bill authorizes military court-ordered involuntary commitment for mental health competency evaluation and treatment services available at the Alaska Psychiatric Institute. As involuntary commitment for evaluation and treatment is currently provided through other courts for Alaska's general population under AS 12.47, this would not change current practice.

DHSS does not anticipate a need for additional funds resulting from this bill.
