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Analysis

This legislation creates an Invasive Species Council (council) within the Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G or department) and a new account, the Invasive Species Response Fund, within the general fund. The council is created as an advisory body tasked with helping facilitate efforts by the ADF&G, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, and other government entities operating in the state to manage invasive species. The council would be comprised of 11 members representing various stakeholder groups and the aforementioned state departments.

The council would be required to meet quarterly and members serve three-year terms without compensation, per diem, or other travel costs. The council would also be required to develop and submit to the Legislature bi-annually a five-year strategic plan to address aspects of invasive species management and an annual report on active invasive species, the effects of these species, and measures taken to manage them.

There will be costs to the department associated with this new advisory council. Funding for a part-time Fisheries Biologist 1 position would be needed for the department's invasive species program to support the council, facilitate implementation of the bill, and assist in drafting the bi-annual strategic plan and annual report. For purposes of this fiscal note, the department assumes one of the quarterly meetings would be held in person and the rest held virtually.

The personal services costs for the part-time Fisheries Biologist 1 position would be \$79.6 for nine months in the first year to assist in standing up the new advisory council and \$53.1 for six months in the outyears. Services costs include \$5.0 for meeting support, including venue fees, technology and equipment setup, and notices and outreach for public involvement.

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
