## **Sponsor Statement**

## House Concurrent Resolution 4, Version A

Proclaiming May 2025 as Myositis Awareness Month

Myositis is a rare autoimmune disease that causes a person's immune system to attack their muscles, resulting in chronic inflammation, weakness and pain. Myositis affects more than 50,000 Americans.

Myositis is often difficult to diagnose, causing treatment delays and diminished quality of life. Left untreated, some forms of myositis can be fatal.

While there is currently no cure, early detection, followed by appropriate and timely treatment, can put the disease into remission and improve quality of life for those with this disease.

House Concurrent Resolution 4 would raise Alaskans' awareness of this rare disease, by proclaiming May 2025 as "Myositis Awareness Month," and encouraging activities to build awareness.

Here in Alaska, HCR 4 could play a role in helping individuals recognize the symptoms of myositis and get treatment sooner. At the national level, it could also help promote further research into this rare disease, help doctors better understand its symptoms and treatment options, and bring hope to those affected.

### A RESOLUTION

### 1 **Proclaiming May 2025 as Myositis Awareness Month.**

### 2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS nearly one in 10 Americans has a rare disease, and residents of the state
are among those affected by myositis and other rare diseases; and

5 **WHEREAS** idiopathic inflammatory myopathies, collectively referred to as myositis, 6 are rare, chronic, autoimmune muscle-wasting diseases, can cause debilitating muscle 7 inflammation, pain, fatigue, and trouble swallowing, and can result in myositis-associated 8 interstitial lung disease; and

9 WHEREAS more research is needed to identify the causes of myositis and modes of 10 treatments for the myositis group of diseases, including anti-melanoma differentiation-11 associated gene 5 dermatomyositis, antisynthetase syndrome, dermatomyositis, juvenile 12 myositis, necrotizing autoimmune myopathy, inclusion body myositis, and polymyositis; and

WHEREAS, because myositis is difficult to diagnose, treatment is often delayed and individuals who have myositis often experience difficulty finding a health care provider with expertise in the disease; and

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WHEREAS individuals who suffer from myositis experience a reduced quality of life

and a shortened life expectancy from complications related to myositis, especially those with
 inclusion body myositis, and no cure has been found; and

WHEREAS The Myositis Association is the leading international patient advocacy
organization serving the myositis community, with a focus on patient services, education,
research, and public awareness to achieve a world without myositis; and

6 **WHEREAS** The Myositis Association is organizing a nationwide observance of 7 myositis awareness for the month of May 2025;

8 **BE IT RESOLVED** the Alaska State Legislature encourages residents of the state to 9 come together, learn about the symptoms and types of myositis, and support individuals and 10 families in local communities who are affected by myositis and can benefit from greater 11 awareness of these rare diseases; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature proclaims the month of
 May 2025 as Myositis Awareness Month.
