## STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB196

## **Analysis**

This bill authorizes 20 percent of the revenue generated from the carbon offset program for appropriation to the Renewable Energy Grant Fund for providing affordable energy to all communities in the state. The bill directs the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) to provide technical assistance to communities with a population of less than 2,000 to help the community prepare and submit grant applications for projects.

If this legislation passes, AEA will need a full-time position and associated costs to provide required technical assistance to communities. These costs are reflected below.
