




Department Structure


FY2026 Operating UGF by Department (Governor's Budget)



Insurance

Regulating the insurance industry to protect Alaskan consumers.

FY2024 Accomplishments

- Processed 62,517 license applications, an 11% increase from FY2024.
- Responded to more than 1,500 consumer inquiries, complaints, and external healthcare reviews.
- In partnership with the Department of Health, initiated a project to improve access to primary care services and identify cost drivers of health care delivery in Alaska, with initial focus on identifying barriers and potential solutions to delivery of and access to primary care services.
- A multi-year capital appropriation in the FY2024 supplemental budget has allowed the division to continue work on the Health Payment Utilization Database (HPUD) project, with a public facing snapshot of the database finally going live by the end of 2024. The HPUD will include Medicaid, Medicare, and the private market.
- Using federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) grant funds, the division updated the Essential Health Benefits for the first time since they were put in place through the Affordable Care Act (ACA) in 2014.
