FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB061

Analysis

This bill creates an electronic product stewardship program in Alaska, making manufacturers responsible for the collection, recycling, and disposal of specific electronics, with department oversight. It also establishes an electronics recycling advisory council, appointed by the commissioner.

Personal Services:

The Division of Environmental Health would require two new positions. A Program Coordinator 2 to oversee the program, including regulations, fee management, data reporting, and advisory council administration. An Environmental Health Specialist 3 will be responsible for compliance, plan reviews, registration, and fee collection.

Travel:

Year one travel covers staff training and program development. In later years, travel will support staff and advisory council member meetings, decreasing once initial program plans are reviewed and approved.

Contractual Services:

Contracted costs cover outreach (toll-free number, website, materials), an annual report, and an electronic registration system (set up in year one, then maintenance). A consulting contract will support program development, compliance, and communications. Financial services will conduct required fee studies.

Commodities:

Supply and equipment costs reflect new employee costs in the first year, and general office supplies in out years.

Funding Source:

The program would initially be funded by UGF, shifting to GFPR as regulations are passed and fees are collected.
