FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 11

Analysis

This bill establishes the Alaska Flood Authority (AFA) to increase the availability of flood insurance in the state. The authority will be required to offer a state flood insurance plan that has the same coverage as the National Flood Insurance Program. This bill also adds a new requirement for flood insurance rates to reflect the actual historical flood and damage date on the property.

The AFA is required to solicit eligible participants to increase awareness of the program and increase participation. This outreach is anticipated to include technical assistance to the approximately 144 Alaska communities that are at risk of flooding but that do not currently participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. The Division of Community and Regional Affairs will provide this technical assistance through direct outreach from three Local Government Specialist (LGS) positions. These positions will leverage the division's subject matter expertise to raise awareness of flood risks in communities and assist local governments with best practices for planning for and addressing flood impacts in their communities and help encourage participation in the flood insurance program. These positions will be funded from receipts collected under the program beginning in the second year; in the first year, they will be funded from the general fund.

If this legislation passes, the Division of Community and Regional Affairs anticipates the following fiscal impacts:
