A RESOLUTION

Supporting federal, state, and local efforts to clean up and remove marine debris from the state; urging the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and the Environmental Protection Agency to provide additional funding for those efforts and to remove barriers faced by tribes and rural communities in accessing those funds; and urging the Alaska Congressional delegation to advocate for increased federal funding and support for marine debris prevention, clean up, removal, backhaul, and education.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Alaskans depend on a clean and healthy ocean and shoreline for sustainable economies, communities, and ways of life; and

WHEREAS the state has more than 30,000 miles of shoreline and an estimated tidal shoreline of almost 50,000 miles, which is more than the rest of the United States combined; and

WHEREAS the state's shoreline faces the North Pacific Ocean, the Gulf of Alaska, and the Bering, Beaufort, and Chukchi seas; and

WHEREAS marine debris causes many adverse effects, including entanglement of and ingestion by birds, fish, and other animals, exposure to toxic chemicals, habitat destruction, and interference with vessel transit and operations; and

WHEREAS these adverse effects can interfere with subsistence, commercial, and recreational fishing, tourism, recreation, and other important aspects of life in the state, even though the affected communities and residents of the state largely did not cause the problem; and

WHEREAS the marine debris problem is particularly acute in the state because of the state's rugged shoreline, ocean currents that concentrate debris in remote locations, and oceandependent coastal communities; and

WHEREAS coastal communities in the state lack the needed resources to transport debris for recycling or disposal even after the debris is removed from beaches; and

WHEREAS the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration has, since 2006, worked with partners to conduct debris research, removal, and prevention and has directly funded projects in the state that have removed nearly 2,000,000 pounds of debris; and

WHEREAS, as of 2014, individual tribes, communities, organizations like Ocean Conservancy, and other partners around the state have removed more than 3,000,000 pounds of debris in documented cleanups; and

WHEREAS the health of the state's fisheries, ocean, and shoreline is foundational to the state's economy;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature supports federal, state, and local efforts to prevent marine debris from reaching the state's shorelines and to promote the clean up and removal of marine debris from the state's shorelines; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, the Environmental Protection Agency, and other federal agencies to dedicate additional funding, and to remove barriers faced by tribes and rural communities in accessing those funds, to support efforts to clean up and remove marine debris from the state; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature supports the work of the Alaska Congressional delegation to advocate for increased federal funding and support for marine debris prevention, clean up, removal, backhaul, and education; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges the state to work with coastal communities, tribes, nonprofit organizations, municipal departments, and the private sector to the greatest extent possible to address the challenges of marine debris as it affects the state's shorelines.
