Analysis

This bill would allow naturopaths to prescribe certain drugs to their patients. The Department estimates that this would result in an increase of 100 prescriptions filled in the Medicaid program each month, at an average cost of \$30/prescription. The annual cost increase to Health Care Medicaid Services would be \$36.0, with 50 percent covered by federal funds and 50 percent covered by General Fund Match.
