BILL NO. SB192

Analysis

SB 192 requires that if a health care insurance plan covers cost or provides indemnity for a physician's services related to childbirth, it shall cover the cost (or provide the indemnity to cover the cost) for a licensed midwife to provide that same care.

SB 192 states it is the intent of the legislature to preserve the right of women to deliver children at home with licensed midwives, and to guarantee insurance coverage for home births.

The Division of Insurance does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
