#### **Student Housing**

AVTEC provides student housing through dormitories and apartments, with a total capacity of 175 beds across different housing units. The current occupancy is 115 students. The breakdown of capacity and current housing occupancy is as follows:

- **Dunham Hall Dormitory** (Capacity: 110) Occupied: 89
  - Double occupancy beds: 4/16
  - Suite occupancy beds: 0/4
  - Standard single beds: 85/90
- 4th Avenue Dormitory (Capacity: 48) Occupied: 18
  - AVTEC students: 6/36
  - o DOC staff rooms: 12
- Apartments (4/6/7 Plex) (Capacity: 17) Occupied: 8
  - o 1-Bedroom Apartments: 2/2
  - 4-Bedroom Apartments: 0/2
  - o 2-Bedroom Standard: 4/9
  - o 2-Bedroom Deluxe: 2/4

### Has teacher compensation at AVTEC increased with the sharp increase in housing costs in Seward (Rep. Fields)?

The instructors at AVTEC are compensated based on the bargained salary schedule and have received increases in recent years. Additionally, AVTEC utilizes housing as an incentive towards recruitment and retention to these positions as a benefit.

## How is the department finding and engaging prospective workforce development program users (Rep. Bynum)?

At the conclusion of the meeting, Representative Bynum expressed interest in having a separate subcommittee meeting to address this topic, and indicated he would speak to the committee aide. The department will prepare to address this question pending that meeting. If a meeting cannot be scheduled to address this topic, the department will follow up in writing.
