FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act relating to the board of parole; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 33.16.020(b) is amended to read:

(b) Members of the board serve for staggered terms of five years and <u>may not</u> <u>serve more than two terms</u> [UNTIL THEIR SUCCESSORS ARE APPOINTED].

* Sec. 2. AS 33.16.020(c) is amended to read:

(c) The governor shall choose the presiding officer of the board from among the membership. <u>A member may not serve more than one term as presiding</u> officer.

* Sec. 3. AS 33.16.030(b) is repealed and reenacted to read:

(b) The board consists of five members, including

(1) one licensed physician, psychologist, or psychiatrist who has experience in treating drug or alcohol addiction;

(2) one victim of a crime, family member of a victim of a crime, or member of a crime victim advocacy group; and
