RE: Retention of Pegasus Global Holdings, Inc. as consultant to the Legislature on proposed Alaska Gasline project.

### Requested consultation subjects:

- Review of “Memo to State of Alaska, Alaska State Legislature, Legislative budget & Audit Committee, April 15, 2019
- Broad megaproject overview of phases and decision points
- What should the Legislature understand of the implications of
  - ownership structure
  - appropriate project governance
  - cost controls and supervision of costs, financing agreements
  - engineering/procurement/construction (EPC) contracts, offtake agreements for in-state gas
  - schedule slippage prevention
  - financial decisions related to tax structure, royalty, production tax
  - ongoing independent monitoring
- Provide ongoing advice to Legislature as Glenfarne/Alaska Gasline Development Corporation proceeds with project

The proposed Alaska Gas Pipeline project has great implications for Alaska financial position and social impact. Alaska needs to maximize the value to the state treasury for the natural gas resources. Taxation of not only the natural gas, but also the corporations gaining financially from the project and the workforce earning wages in Alaska.

The Legislature needs to have a clear understanding of the fiscal impacts as well as the social impacts. Housing, transportation, public safety, and workforce preparation are topics that must be addressed timely and effectively.

Timeline: Pegasus on contract as a resource by January 20, 2026 would be ideal. The Senate Resources committee would utilize their expertise as early as January 21. The Senate Arctic Affairs may also utilize their input on Arctic construction implications of the pipeline project.
