FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 11

Analysis

SB 11 establishes the Alaska Flood Authority (AFA) in the state as a "nonprofit incorporated legal entity." It also establishes a flood insurance fund in the general fund.

If this legislation is adopted, the Division of Insurance will be responsible for administering collections to the fund and coordinating an annual grant to the new nonprofit corporation. The division director will participate as an ex-officio member of the board, and approve the annual plan of operation for the AFA.

The division will require two Program Coordinators and one Administrative Assistant to manage activities related to the AFA and the flood insurance program for the division, as well as associated support costs. The Program Coordinators and the Administrative Assistant will be funded from insurance licensing receipts already collected by the division in the first year, which are more than sufficient to support these costs. One Program Coordinator will be established as a non-permanent position for three years to support the initial program setup and initial program operations.

The division also anticipates requiring contractual actuarial and other support for initial implementation of the flood authority, which is requested as a capital appropriation from the new flood insurance fund as the timing of the work is not yet known.

If this legislation passes, the Division of Insurance anticipates the following fiscal impacts:
