 - Iñupiat University of the Arctic
 - University of Alaska Extension Center
 - North Slope Higher Education Center
 - Arctic Sivunmun Iñisagvik College
 - Mayor's Workforce Development Center
- 1996 – Iñisagvik College (accredited)
- 2005 – Became a Federally Recognized Tribal College
- 2025 – Land acquisition from UIC for New Iñisagvik College
- 2026 – 30th Anniversary



American Indian Higher Education Consortium (AIHEC)

- AIHEC has grown to 37 Tribal Colleges and Universities (TCU) with more than 80 sites in the United States.
- Iḷisaġvik College is Alaska's Only Tribal College
- Tribally chartered with a purpose purpose to provide, local, holistic, higher education opportunities.
- TCU's have become increasingly important to educational opportunity for Alaska Native & American Indian students



 - 53,501 GSF Academic classrooms, student support, cafeteria, offices, student dormitories
- Phase 2
 - 28,673 GSF Career and workforce development, IT, and M&O
- Phase 3
 - 28,933 GSF Early Learning Center, fieldhouse, more student dormitories
- Total Cost \$214,451,768
