

Alaskans Served in 2024



- 93,315 new cases filed (trial and appellate courts)
- 5,691 contacts thru the Family Law Self-Help Center
- 3,573 Alaskans served on juries
- 7,738,378 visits to the court's website
- 2,664,760 CourtView searches
- 26,464 online payments made
- 429 therapeutic court participants
- Tens of thousands of on-line court forms accessed or downloaded



Trial Court Caseloads – FY23 vs. FY24



- FY24 Trial Court Case Filings Totaled 92,719
 - ➤ Up 0.8 % from FY23 Total Trial Court Filings
- FY24 Superior Court Cases Totaled 20,637
 - Down 3.4% from FY23 Superior Court Case Totals
- FY24 District Court Cases Totaled 72,082
 - Up 2.1% from FY23 District Court Case Totals

- > FY26 Personal Services Budgeted Underfunding = 7.2%
- Excludes judges, temporary, and non-permanent positions
- ➤ On 1/30/2025, the Alaska Court System had 49 vacant non-judge positions and six of these will be filled in early February

- Five Supreme Court Justices
- Four Court of Appeal Judges
- 45 Superior Court Judges
- 20 District Court Judges
- 39 Magistrate Judges




FY26 State of Alaska Operating Budget Request




Alaska Court System FY25 Operating Budget Appropriation All Fund Types

^{*}The court system requested \$552,300 in ongoing maintenance and operating expenses, but \$188,800 of this request was not included in the governor's budget. The projected FY26 cost increases for DOT-leased facilities are not finalized and the negotiated lease executed in January, 2025 for Utqiagvik is lower than initially projected.
