STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 63

Analysis

This bill amends AS 44.33.810 to increase the number of local boundary commission members from five to six. This bill also adds a requirement that commission members from each judicial district must maintain a principal place of residence and be registered to vote in that district.

This bill provides an effective date of January 31, 2026.

If this legislation passes, the Division of Community and Regional Affairs anticipates an increase of travel expenditures totaling \$10.0 for the additional commission member.
