FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill creates two new felony level crimes for the possession and distribution of generated obscene child sexual abuse material. These crimes include increased penalty ranges for recidivist convictions and are listed as sex offenses.

The Agency is unable to effectively predict how many people would be charged under this statute and of those the number that would be appointed counsel. The Agency submits a zero fiscal note at this time but will request additional funding in future budget cycles if the legislation results in significant workload increases.
