Analysis

This legislation amends AS 28.35 by adding a new section AS 28.35.248 Airbag fraud. This legislation would make airbag fraud a class A misdemeanor; or a C felony if death or serious physical injury to another person results from the manufacture, sale, importation, installation, or reinstallation of a replacement airbag that does not comply with federal safety regulations to the vehicle's make, model, and year or a counterfeit or nonfunction airbag or the sale, lease, or trade of a vehicle with an airbag as previously described.
While it is expected that this legislation may have an impact on the daily offender population, there is no data available to project the actual impact. However, based on the current prison population, any increase can be absorbed within the department's existing resources and capacity. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is submitted for this legislation.
