FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill will allow a person who is over the age of 16, but under the age of 18, to preregister to vote. This preregistration would then allow the Division of Elections to register that individual to vote 90 days before their 18th birthday and automatically deliver a voter registration card to that individual.

This would require the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to update our programming within our internal system both for in-person processing as well as online voter registration. It would also require an update to multiple DMV forms and staff training. Additionally, DMV will need to update the information provided to the Division of Elections.

Due to the high demand for programming efforts within the DMV IT staff, the division is currently two years behind on critical projects. To prioritize the programming required for HB 21, the DMV needs contracting support in order to apply any new legislation. The costs assume of \$150.00 per hour for not to exceed 300 hours.
