Analysis

HB 64 amends the Children in Need of Aid (CINA) statute 47.10.013(c) (Abandonment – Safe Surrender) by adding a method through which an infant may be safely surrendered. The amendment introduces the use of an infant safety device, in addition to surrendering to a physical person. It also defines the department's authority to implement and train individuals on the use of such a device, and specifies what constitutes a designated facility.

This legislation is unlikely to have a fiscal impact to the department. However, the funding source for the safe surrender program remains unclear as described in this amendment.
