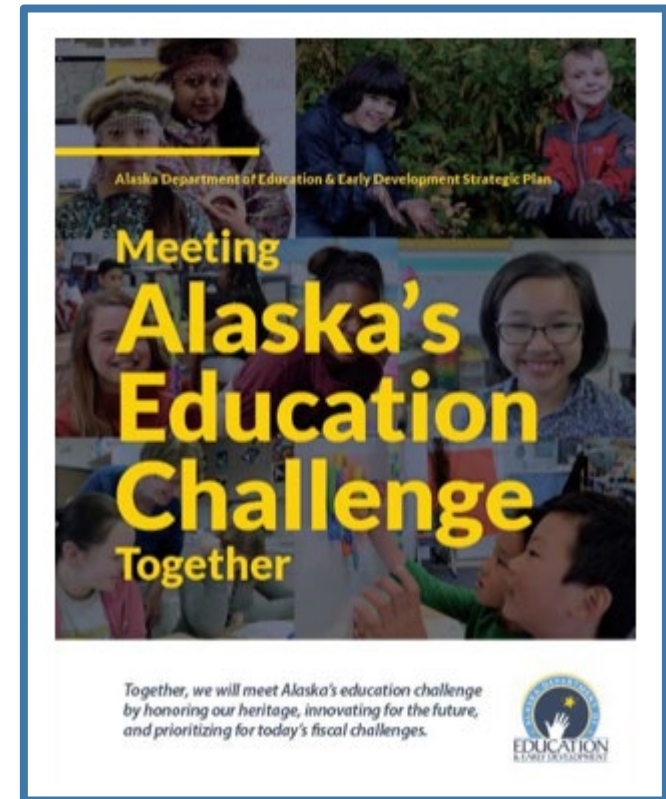
Mission, Vision, and Purpose

Mt. Edgecumbe High School: A Rich History

- Established in 1947 by the federal Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA)
- Housed within a World War II naval facility
- MEHS operated as part of a network of BIA boarding schools serving students from remote communities across Alaska; closed in 1980
- In 1985, MEHS was reopened as a state-operated boarding school, within the Department of Education and Early Development, under oversight by the Alaska State Board of Education
- 2025 – Major Changes in Operations



Right-Sizing the Ship

FY2025:

- Projected \$1.6 million over budget - discovered August 2024
 - COVID funds expired: funds used on operational costs- personnel and contracts
 - Contract increases FY2019 to FY2025: Dorm 24% and Food Service 102%
 - Staff concerns growing; DEED makes six on-site visits between December 2024 and July 2025

FY2026 Budget Planning:

- Staffing reductions to pre-COVID; 4 teachers and 1 administrator and 2 support staff
- Request for Proposals (RFP) for Dorm and Food/Kitchen vendor- added 2 positions back into the contract that were removed in 2023 and laundry services added

June & July FY2026:

- Changes in leadership
 - Superintendent, David Langford, came back to MEHS
 - Dorm Principal resigned; Two critical dorm positions followed
- Transition to new contractor- dorm and kitchen deep clean and upgrades needed

Changes during the School Year:

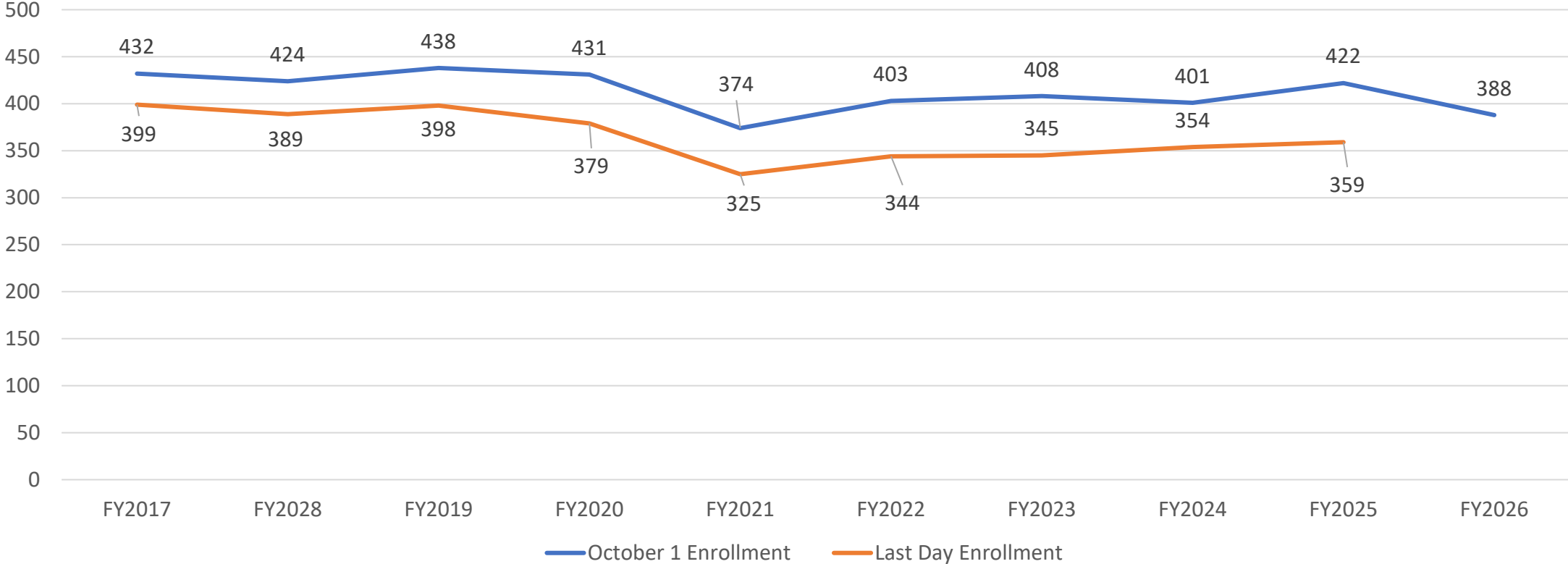
- Comprehensive Literacy State Development Grant awarded
 - New Reading/Library teacher hired
 - Staff Development in January 2026
 - Funds to enhance the Library book collection
- NANA Management awarded a swim safety grant

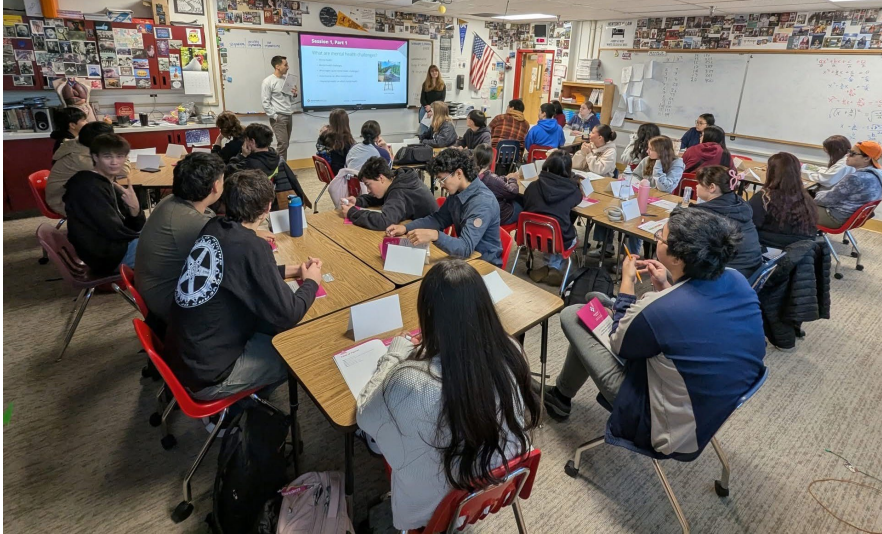

New & Expanding Education Options



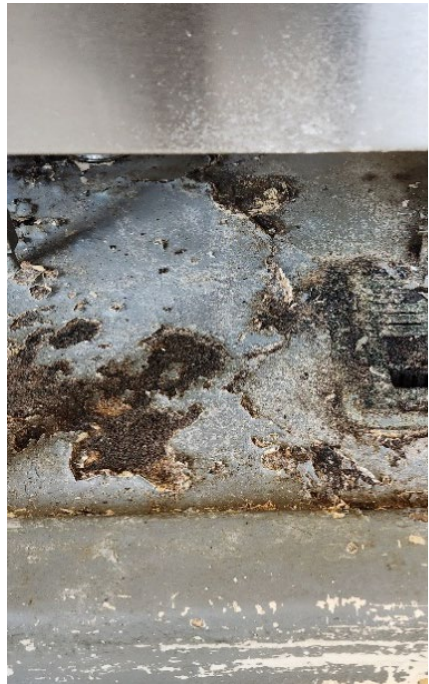
New:

Expanding:

- Welding classes – Dual Enrollment with the University of Alaska Southeast (UAS): increased from three classes to five
- Driver’s Training
- Introduction to Emergency Services and Health Careers – Dual Enrollment through UAS



MEHS Kitchen – June 2025

FY2025 USDA Inspection - 59 violations

Kitchen Upgrades:

To ensure the kitchen was student-ready, the department, in coordination with MEHS leadership, carried out extensive upgrades, repairs, and replacements **totaling \$154,800**

- Large Equipment replacement: \$80,000
- Partial floor repair and replacement of some ceiling tiles: \$3,000
- Replaced all cooking and serving equipment, including pans, pots, sheet pans, and serving dishes: \$19,000
- Electrical updates: \$15,000
- Deep clean: \$8,000
- Plumbing upgrades: \$10,000
- Hand sink install: \$13,000

FY2026 USDA Inspection: 4 findings

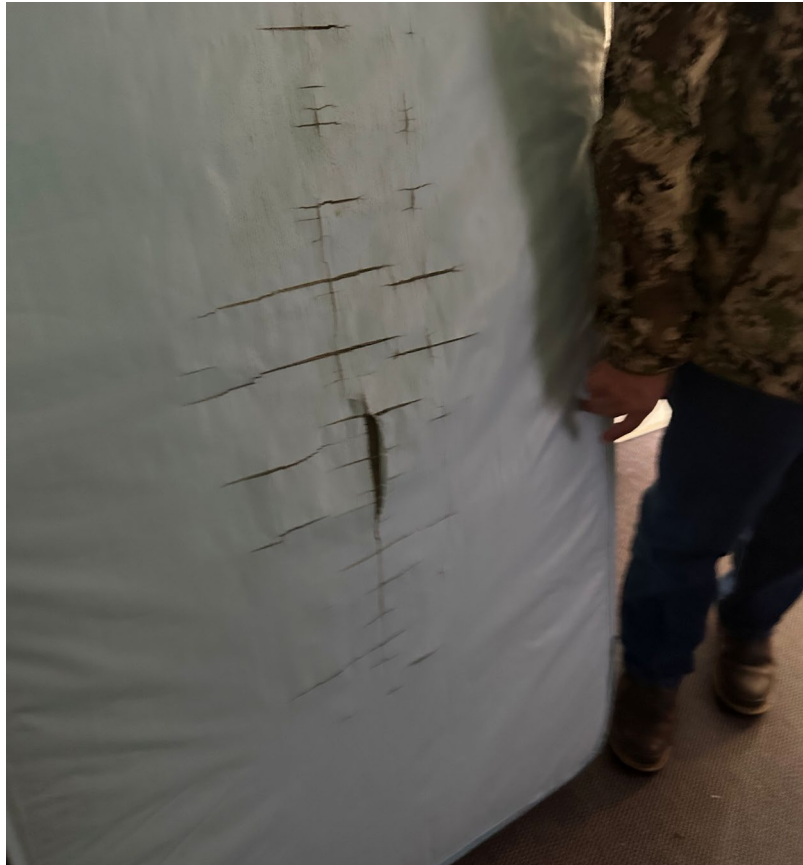
- Student snacks not logged in the correct format
- 3 Clerical errors

Student Engagement

NANA Management took over the Kitchen and Dorm contracts in July 2025. Since then:

- Year-to-date meal counts are up by **20%**
- Monthly collaboration between NANA & Students
- Student workers hired
- Incorporation of indigenous foods
- The school year started on time





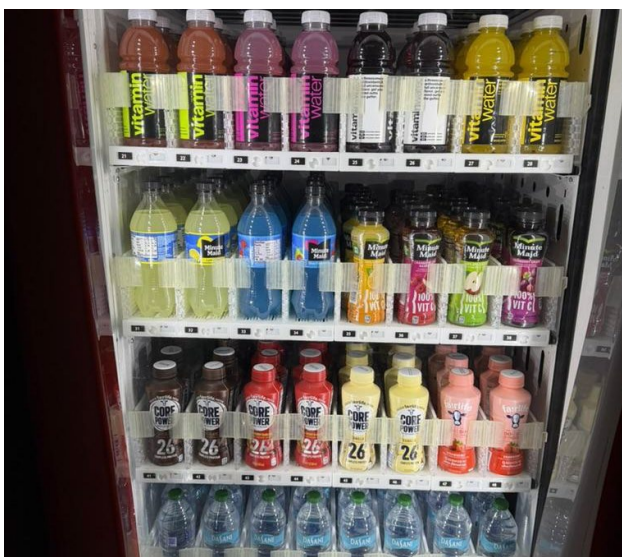
MEHS State Dormitories – June 2025

Dormitory Upgrades

- MEHS & NANA fully staffed
- Dorms received a deep clean
- 40 new mattresses
- All dorm lounges received new furniture and updated looks
- Vending machines stocked with healthier alternatives

- Ivy Dorm Roof Patch

Beginning May 2026

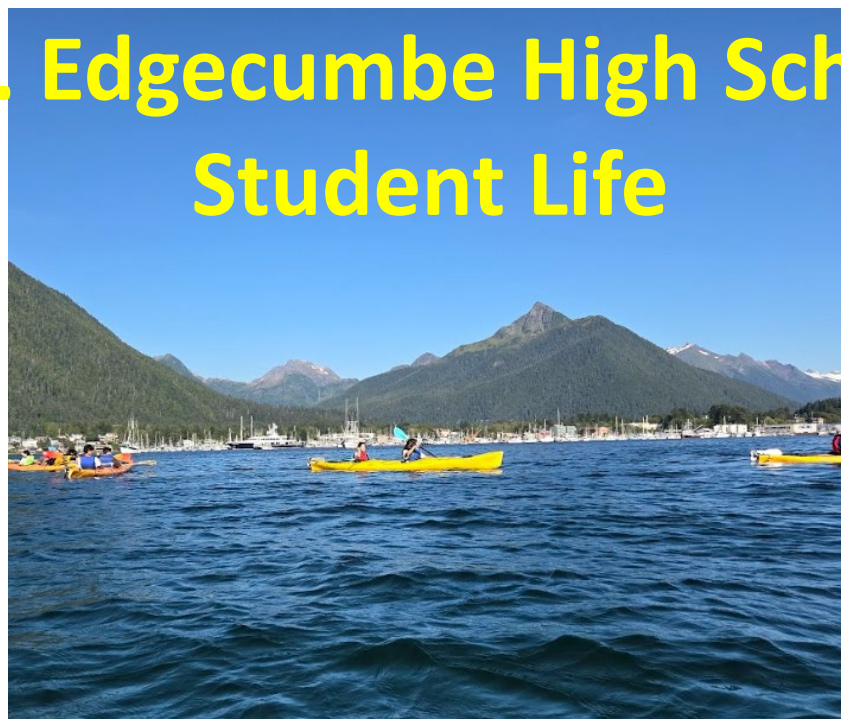
- Replacement of Ivy Hall and both dorm roofs

- Window replacements



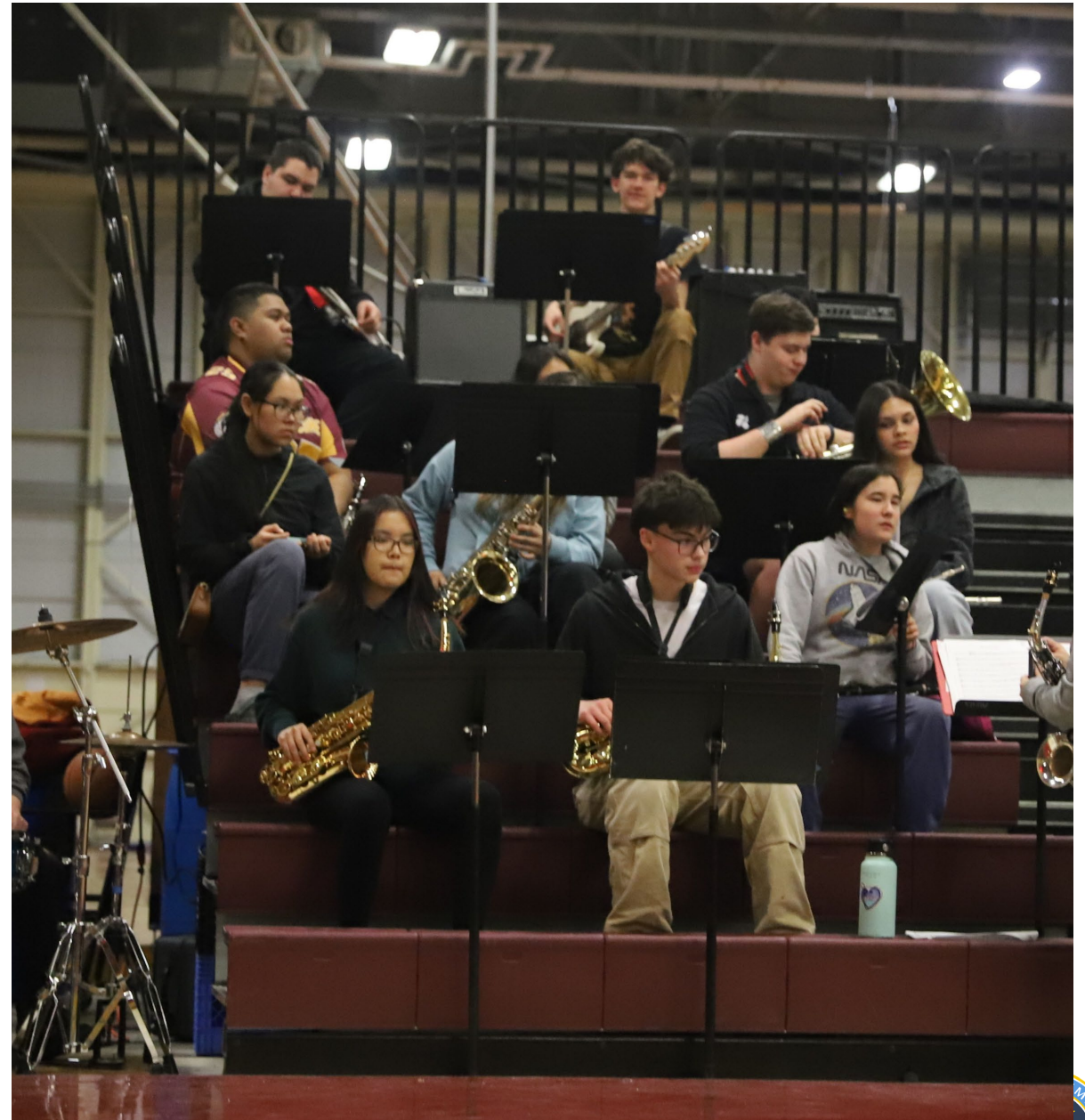

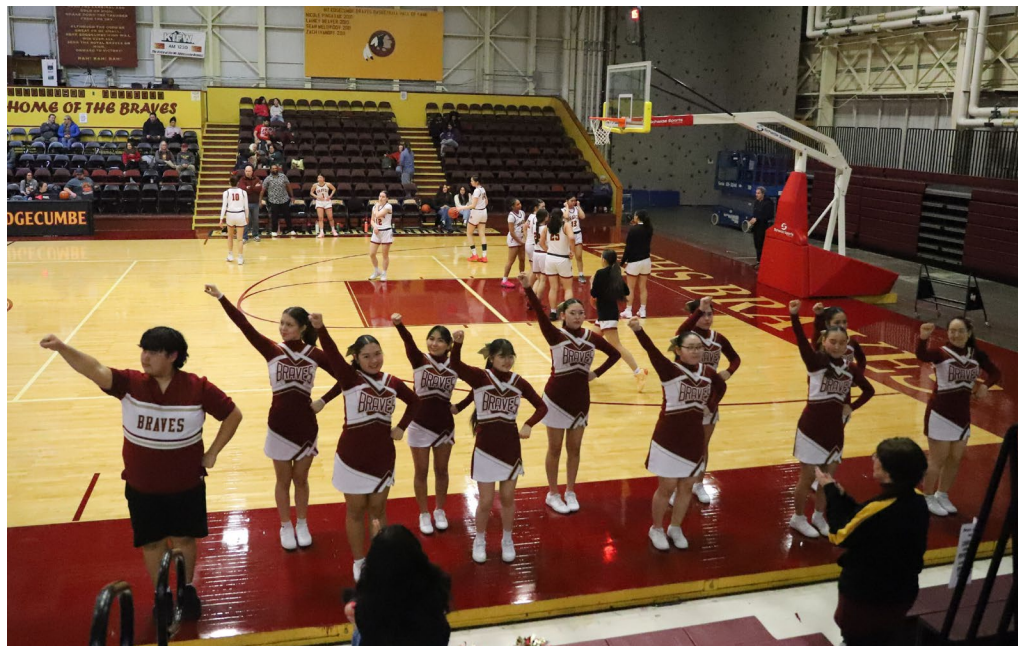

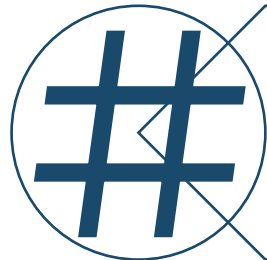
