Good Afternoon Senate Affairs Committee,

I oppose this bill due to there are Federal Laws on the books that cover this issue. Also the Federal law supersedes State law. Under The National Firearms Act and 26 U.S.C. § 5845(b) and 18 U.S.C. § 921(a)(24) as, “any weapon which shoots, is designed to shoot, or can be readily restored to shoot, automatically more than one shot, without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger. This wording is almost if not exactly the same. Also to cover the rest of the bill being put forth is also covered by ATF, which is a law enforcement agency in the U.S. Department of Justice that protects our communities from violent criminals, criminal organizations, the illegal use and trafficking of firearms, the illegal use and storage of explosives( Code of Federal Regulations Title 27. Alcohol, Tobacco Products and Firearms § 27.555.201 General). With all this being said, there is no reason that the State should engage in making laws which are already required by the Federal Government.
